



Utah Premier Cup - TOURNAMENT RULES



The Utah Premier Cup will be played in accordance with FIFA Laws of the Game, as modified by USYSA, UYSA, and as specifically noted below.

1. CREDENTIALS: All players shall be properly registered with their respective state organizations. Team officials shall have a current official league roster (or travel tournament roster), medical release forms, player passes (for out of state teams), and all applicable guest player forms. These documents shall be presented to Tournament officials at team check-in, or a minimum of one hour prior to their first match, for verification. These documents are required to be available for the duration of the tournament. The travel tournament roster and/or player cards will be used for match check-in.

2. FLIGHT BRACKETING: Team flight and bracket assignments are determined by the Tournament Committee and based on the most recent UYSA Final Alignment document. Appeals of the flight and/or bracket will NOT be accepted.

3. PLAYER ELIGIBILITY: Player rosters are frozen at final team check-in and no amendments will be allowed after the first game has started. Additional licensed coaches may be added to a roster, prior to the published start of any match. Teams are allowed to have up to 6 guest players on the roster. Guest players (loaned) must have an accompanying signed guest player form. Club pass players are not considered guest players and they must be rostered as a club pass player. Player eligibility will be verified prior to each match. A team shall forfeit a match (or matches) where it uses a non-rostered player. A player may only be rostered and play on one team during the tournament, in accordance with UYSA policy 935.3.

4. HOME TEAM & UNIFORMS: The first team listed on the published schedule is the home team. UYSA Policy 6315.6 will govern. The home team will have sideline choice of the field for each match. In the event of a uniform color conflict the home team must change.

5. SIDELINE POLICY: UYSA policy 6315.5 will govern. Spectators must sit on the same sideline as their team.

6. BALL, FIELD, and TEAM SIZE: UYSA policy 6.6 Appendix A will govern field sizes.

7. MATCH LENGTH: Injury time may be added to a match if necessary. If injury time is more than 10 minutes during a game, future game times may be adjusted to accommodate all games played that day. Stoppage time will NOT be added to the match length. A winner will advance from each elimination match. If an elimination match is tied at the end of the match, kicks from the penalty mark will determine the winner.

8. MATCH START TIME: Both teams must present a rostered coach and the minimum number of rostered players, at the published start time of the match, or the match will be forfeited.

9. MATCHES:

A Team representative must have the following at each game:

- A copy of the roster to be provided to the head referee;
- Player passes, if required; and
- A copy of all guest player forms.
- Failure to bring required documentation to a game will result in a forfeit of that game.

10. SUBSTITUTIONS: UYSA Policy 6315.8 will govern and ALL substitutions are at the discretion of the referee.

11. HEADING FOR U12 AND YOUNGER: UYSA Policy 6356.8 will govern.

- A. If a player deliberately heads the ball in a game, an indirect free kick (IFK) should be awarded to the opposing team from the spot of the offense.
- B. If the deliberate header occurs within the penalty area, the indirect free kick (IFK) should be taken on the penalty area line parallel to the goal line at the point nearest to where the infringement occurred.

12. BUILD-OUT LINES FOR U10 AND YOUNGER: UYSA Policy 6315.1 will govern.

13. MATCH DISCIPLINE: UYSA Policy 6315.10 thru 6315.12 will govern, with the following amendments;

- A. Any team causing a match to be abandoned shall be declared the loser of said match. The Tournament Committee may declare the match a forfeit and the scoring system below shall apply. Upon review of the referee match report, the Tournament Committee may expel the losing team from the tournament.
- B. Expelled and unruly coaches or spectators will be asked to leave the facility (minimum 300 yards from any playing field). Failure to comply may cause the match to be abandoned.
- C. The conduct of ALL coaches, players, and spectators expelled from a match shall be reviewed by the Tournament Committee. Upon review of the referee match report, the Tournament Committee may expel these individuals from the remainder of the tournament.

14. SIDELINE BEHAVIOR:

It shall be the responsibility of each team to maintain proper spectator conduct. The coaches, manager, and the team shall be held primarily accountable for the conduct of the spectators from the respective teams. At no time shall foul or abusive language be permitted. Violations of this rule can result in teams forfeit of game/or removal from the tournament as determined by the tournament director and committee.

Spectators may only sit in the spectator designated areas and not by the teams or behind the goals.

Coaching from the sidelines (giving direction to one's own team on points of strategy and position) is allowed as long as it is within the technical areas provided:

- The tone of voice is informative and not derogatory;
- No coach, substitute, or player is allowed to make derogatory remarks or gestures to the referees, other players, substitutes, opposing coaches or spectators;
- No coach, substitute, or player uses profanity;
- No coach, substitute, or player may incite in any manner; disruptive behavior

Alcohol or illegal drug use, or possession or transportation of a weapon without a valid permit, shall not be permitted at the tournament.

15. WEATHER: The Tournament Committee may alter the duration of future matches to accommodate weather related schedule delays. In the event of a significant weather related delay, the semi-final matches may be eliminated. When applicable, if the temperature on the field is 87 degrees or hotter the referee will allow a quick 2 min water break during each half. Extra time will not be added. This can be used as a substitution moment.

16 SCORING & STANDINGS: After verification of the match referee's report, match results will be published on the Tournament website. Scores will NOT be accepted from coaches, players, spectators or team managers. Pool play matches will be scored as follows:

- 6 points for a win, 3 points for a tie, 0 points for a loss.
- 1 point for each goal (up to a maximum of 3 goals).
- 1 point for a shut-out.
- A 0-0 tie will be awarded 4 points for each team (3 points for the tie and 1 point for the shut-out).
- Forfeited matches will be awarded 8 points. A team forfeiting one match will forfeit all matches.

17. TIE BREAKERS: In the event two (or more) teams within a bracket are tied in points at the end of pool play, the following tie breakers will be applied, in the order given, to determine the advancing team.

1. Head to head play: If the teams played in pool play, the winner of the match.
2. Goal differential: The team with the highest goal differential (goals for minus goals against).
3. Goals against: The team allowing the least number of goals.
4. Goals for: The team scoring the most number of goals.
5. Shoot-out or coin toss: The Tournament Committee will decide if teams participate in a shoot-out (kicks from the penalty mark) or a coin toss. This is dependent upon match schedules, availability of fields, and referees.

18. AWARDS: Awards will be presented to the Flight Champion and Finalist immediately following the conclusion of the Final match..

19. MATCH PROTESTS: All matches shall be considered final. **Protests will NOT be accepted or considered.**

20. REFUNDS: No entry fees refunds will be issued, after; (1) the published application deadline, (2) a team has been accepted to the tournament, (3) and the tournament schedule has been published. Prior to completion of the above noted conditions, entry fee refunds may be made, less any incurred administrative costs or processing fees.

21. LITTER & GARBAGE: We believe in keeping the fields at our parks clean. All litter and garbage MUST be removed from the field immediately after each match. Sidelines littered with garbage may result in point deductions, or forfeit of a match, as determined by the Tournament Committee. Only dogs are allowed at the Regional Athletic Complex and must be leashed at all times. Dogs must be picked up after by the owner/caretaker.
